Migrant Education Program

Each year many Nome school age children qualify for services under the provisions of the Federal Migrant Education Program. This includes lunch benefits, books, and other services.

The most common qualifying migrant activity in Nome is a family taking children to fish camp for a minimum of 7 nights and an indication from the parent that obtaining and storing of salmon is one of the family's principal means of livelihood. The program is available to any Nome area family, regardless of ethnicity, with children who meet the key criteria for eligibility.
